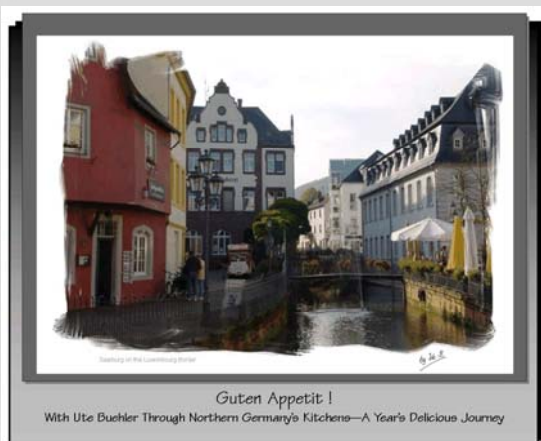
As a photographer Ute makes pictures, photo calendars and note cards of her travels through Europe and the U.S., and, of course, of Stillwater.
